

## **SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT**

### **Environmental Clause**

With its own policy of sustainable development, Edison Group has the objective to reduce its environmental impact, also through the adoption and maintenance of environmental management systems certified UNI EN ISO 14001 for all its activities.

As part of its environmental, safety and health integrated policy, Edison Group is committed to:

- Manage and mitigate environmental impact, contribute to reduction of climate effects, create the culture of energy efficiency and a service efficient service for the customers, develop an energetic model coherent with environmental constraints.
- Eliminate or mitigate any risk related to health and safety in working environments.

Edison group is a stakeholder in this approach for continuous improvement, promoting Environmental management systems by also seeking UNI EN ISO 14001 certification for all its sites.

In this context, one of the principles of environmental and safety policy of Edison Group is to involve Suppliers in the identification and correct management of environmental impacts of their activities, especially concerning relevant aspects like waste management and use of chemical products.

As a result, the Supplier shall pass this policy on its sub-contractors, reminding them that the contract must strictly satisfy the regulations in force.

As part of its duty to advise, and to allow companies part of Edison Group to keep to their commitments regarding the UNI EN ISO 14001 certification, the Holder is also required, under performance of the contract, to send to Edison Group any relevant or useful information relating the environment impacts (existing commitments, planned improvement actions, reduction or prevention of impact obtained, ...) and to advise it of any circumstances likely to have a significant impact on the environment.

The duty of advisor, like the obligations required of the Supplier with respect to the present Clause shall be assessed with regard to and within the limits of the missions entrusted to it in accordance with its specific competences.

**Social clause**

In accordance with its ethical commitments, Edison Group is particularly attached to the fundamental principles and rights set forth in the United Nations' Declaration of Human Rights, the United Nations' Global Compact, and the European Union's Charter of Fundamental Rights.

Edison Group applies these fundamental principles and rights to its purchases, and more particularly those relating to child labour and forced or compulsory labour.

The Appointed Contractor recognises that it has taken cognizance of the aforementioned fundamental principles and right. It subscribes to them and undertakes to abide by them.

It undertakes to use the industrial and human means required to ensure its application by itself, its sub-contractors and its Suppliers. It moreover undertakes to justify its implementation to the Company when requested.

Edison Group reserves the possibility of having a competent and duly authorised company check that the working conditions in the sites of the Supplier, its subcontractors and its Suppliers are not in contradiction with these principles and rights.
